### **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

### **Response:**

At the commencement of the academic year the staff meeting is conducted under the guidance of the principal of the college. This is for allotment subjects, class teachers and to prepare and finalized academic calendar in accordance with Savitribai Phule, Pune University norms. All related academic matters such as examinations, sports, culture, library, research, counselling, Alumni are taken into consideration for the preparation of academic calendar. The meetings of head of the department, faculties are also conducted periodically. Since 2019. as per the directives of the Savitribai Phule Pune University we are following CBCs, accordingly we encourage the students to select the subjects as per their choice and likings. Teaching and learning is a continuous process, we ensure good classroom teaching and also adopt the use of ICT enabled some techniques. This include PPT presentation by the teachers to explain some important concepts. We are conducting, the classroom test and tutorials in the class, especially one lecture in a Week is used for the purpose of such test. This help us for the better Understanding of the subject, by the students. Effective delivery of the curriculum necessarily need not mean to teach in classroom, it also include better evaluation method. The Entire syllabus of the subject: divided into two parts as Term 1 (sem. 1) and Term II (sem. 2). This is as per the structure framed by Savitribai Phule Pune University. In Sem.1 College conducts internal Examination. The question papers are designed by college teachers, strictly a per the University norms. The Assessment of internal examination is being done at college level. This internal Assessment programme is being carried out in the college itself as Central Assessment programme (CAP)." The Marks obtained by the students are added to external (University examination) and combined average marks are considered for passing. The students from 2019 are to select the choice based subject every year. These subject are to be selected by the student's as per the availability of the subject. The grade is allotted to students in order to declare the student as cleared the said course. Special lectures are arranged to teach CBCS Subject and is evaluated by the concerned subject teacher. Practical's are also designed in subjects of commerce such as financial Accounting, Business communication, banking likewise which is well designed by the college. The BBA students undertake the internship as per the syllabus. This is also well designed by college, as per Savitribai Phule Pune University rules. The college teachers adopt continuous assessment program for this purpose our teachers conduct test, tutorials group discussion in college hours. Also study visits and practical's are conducted as per the rules.

- Before the academic year starts the budget is prepared which is inclusive of salary and other academic expenses such as purchases of books purchase of furniture, security charges, salary to office & teaching staff and other expenses.
- For conducting the smooth fees as per university rules. From this amount collected all examination expenses are meeting out. These expenses include seminars/junior supervisor's remuneration, traveling charge, office staff remuneration, stationery and other expense.
- We are following principal of almost utilization of resources. Our college premises are being utilization throughout the day for conducting the classes and practical of BBA, BCA and B.com. Separate time table is prepared to conduct these classes
- Accounts head is responsible to maintain the accounts and prepared the financial statements at the year

From the fees collected certain expense are made on purchase of library books and providing the academic services to the students such as Wi-Fi services, Internet services. Our college has limited financial resources. We are not getting any Government or Non-Government Grants but by systematic approach of utilisation of funds we are trying to provide better work environment and facilities to the students and the staff.

- The financial expenses are monitored by the finance Committee and the funds are utilised properly for revenue and capital expenditure.
- For purchases of equipment or any material required for college we obtained the requisition from the staff. The quotation from suppliers is demanded and proper quotation is selected after which the purchase order is placed to the suppliers. After the material is received payment is duly carried out.
- The Principal and Management Authorities ensures that the said expenses is within the limitations of budget and we take due care in minimisation of expenditure with no compromise with the quality.
- The budget for the next academic year is prepared at the end of present academic year.
- This budget includes salary and recurring expenditure.
- The capital expenditure is being done by Management.
- At the end of the each financial year statutory audit is conducted.
- Optimum utilisation of college building, computer Lab and Library is being ensured.

The sports, extracurricular activities being carried out time to time, thus financial utilisation is properly enacted.

- At the end of each semester students are properly evaluated and their performance is conveyed to them at the end of the semester and any doubt regarding evaluation has been properly dealt in as per the university norms. Some of our students have taken admissions in foreign universities and some students are employed in service/industrial sector.

Thus, the IQAC cell is providing better working environment policies for the upliftment of our academic growth. The teachers are been promoted to participate in seminar and conferences and also to appear for NET/SET examination and to complete the research work.

### The Context:

- 2. The parents could not pay the fees as prescribed for that course. So, we allow the students to pay the fees in the instalments and on merit of individual case, we provide the concession to the students.
- 3. The moral concept of providing education to all and to reach to the common man is being worked out because of that.

### The Practice:

On the basis of various factors, every year we provide concession to the students. Both boys and girls are provided this concession every year. We follow no discrimination for getting this concession.

- 1.It is given irrespective of the caste, creed, religion, language and gender. The factors consider are the academic performance of the students, their attendance in the college, the income of parents.
- 2. The college collects the application from the students if they require any concession in fees.
- 3. The said application is put before the management for their consent. The management considers application on the criteria discussed above.
- 4. Every year the deserving and needy students are granted concessions in fees by the college.
- 5. The overall objective is to promote education and to help students in continuing their education. Also we ensure that students cannot leave their education uncompleted.
- 6. Because our college is self-finance college, we have no government aid and so we work with the

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objective of social responsibility more than the commercialization of education.

- 7. A partial concession in fees is given to the students who cannot afford the fees. This helps the students continue their studies without any break in education.
- 8. This is compensation for an act, provided by the college.
- 9. Every year the concession in fees is granted to the students.
